The target for the year 2006 was 95, but achievement was 124. 117 Students were admitted to Govt. Schools and the balance 07 Students dropped out as some got married and some others got displaced.

Others are not employed because they do not have sewing Machines. However, they will get assistance to buy sewing machines through ODW in the year 2007. In the year 2005, 110 female youth were trained and 27 are self-employed and receiving a monthly income of 2000 to 3500 rupees. We have applied for financial assistance from ODW to help the rest in the year 2007. In 2006, 27 have completed training in sewing cutting. These youth were selected from those who have already completed their sewing training in 2004 & 2005. Among them 07 are self employed and earning a monthly income of 4000 to 6000 rupees. We have applied for financial assistance from ODW to help the rest in the year 2007.

They will be provided opportunities to do wiring of the houses under construction for the Tsunami affected victims.

Others are still seeking employment. We have made arrangements with the Sri Lanka Vocational Training Authorities to provide further training in computer.

Brief description of the activity (Qualitative information and challenges, changes during the project implementation)

1. Catch up Education

Three villages namely Mahiladithivu, Panchenai and Thikkodai have been identified to implement this project in the year 2006. Accordingly 42 children in Mahiladithivu(3 dropped out, got married displaced), 21 students in Panchenai(3 dropped out) and 61 students in Thikkodai (1 dropped out due to displacement) were selected and an examination was held. Those children from Mahiladithivu and Thikkodai were divided into two groups according to their standard and were entrusted to two Teachers. 117 students have been sent back to the school from the year 2007.

Changes:

Two new centres for catch up education have been started at Thuraineelavanai and Mahiloor in view of the experienced difficulties in going to conflict areas.

These catch up centres will begin to function and there will be another centre added in the year 2007.

1. Sewing and Cutting training

This additional training was to be provided to those who have completed their sewing training in 2005. Accordingly, by selecting 27 girls further training was provided in sewing and cutting so that they could be self-employed and increase their family income. This training was conducted at two places in which 27 girls successfully completed the training as following:-

1. Kirankulam – 15
2. Navatkudah – 12

Among the 27 trainees 16 girls are involved in permanent income generation activities in the shop started by NERTRA. NERTRA owns the shop and the girls are given cloth materials in order to sew garments. Their earning per month is between Rs.3000-5000/=.

Further two batches started from October 2006 under the additional funds allocation. This includes sewing 06 months and cake icing, Hair dressing; machine repairs for three months.

2. Driving Training

This training is being carried out aimed at helping the boys. Also most of them are interested in undergoing this training since their employment opportunities can be better and feasible after such training. It is in consideration of this fact such training was arranged. The target in the beginning of the year was 25 trainees but achievement was 39 trainees. Another batch of trainings approved by the PSO based on NERTRA's request based demand of the youth. Target for this second batch was 20 but we have achieved 22 with the contribution of participants. Ceylon Transport Board and Nadeera Learners, Ayngaran learners are the training school hired for this purpose.

The training could not be completed within the stipulated period. Kidnapping of youngsters and shooting incidents were some of the causes. However we were able to complete the training in spite of all these challenges.

3. House wiring Training

This training was commenced in October 2006 under a new allocation of funds. It is being conducted at the Kaluwanchikudy Centre and the duration of the course is 06 months for 20 boys. The course will be completed in 2007.

4. Psychosocial work

Consequent to the Tsunami Disaster most of the people were found psychologically affected. Majority of them are students, and as NERTRA found out that their problems have to be addressed in order to continue its programme. In order to help them recover from psycho-traumatic situations NERTRA started such activities in 2005. And this was implemented specially aiming at the progress of school children. In the year 2006, this project was extended to 05 more Villages, and the beneficiaries were not only students, but other people who had such problems were also identified. These villages are Tharmapuram, Kurukkalmadam, Mankadu, Kaluthavalai and Kaluwanchikudy. In order to implement this activities with the participation of the people, 25 girls consisting of 05 girls from each village were trained in psychosocial activities. These volunteers would visit each house in their villages, discuss with the affected members and submit reports to the officer concerned in NERTRA office. The NERTRA office would provide them necessary assistance in this regard. 50 cases have been identified in 2006 and found ways of solving their problems. NERTRA had established psychosocial committees in five villages during 2006 consisting of 3 to 5 volunteers in each committee and youth members. They would help identify cases that need further treatment.

The cases which need further assistance are referred to government hospitals of other experts in this field.

5. Peace promotion activities

This program is aimed at creating peace through creating understanding between the Tamil and Muslim Communities. A youth group has been formed and activated in achieving this aim consisting of 15 boys and girls from Navatkuda and an equal number of boys and girls from the Muslim community. In Order to strengthen this project, several programmes are being held.

- **Leadership and Communication Training**

A workshop was held consisting of all the 30 members in order to strengthen their mutual relationship and to create a better leadership in both communities. Through this training it was easy to create close relationship between the communities and how it could pave a means to reduce such communal conflicts.

- **Conflict and resolution training**

A workshop was held to explain as to how conflicts can occur between these two communities and how it could be solved.

- **Tamil, Muslim Celebrations**

Religions celebrations consisting of both communities were held. Saraswathy Pooja(Hindu) was held in which Muslim boys and girls participated. Similarly “Meelath Celebration” (Muslim) was also held with the participation of Tamil youth. Cultural activities of both communities were successfully held during these celebrations.

Through these arrangements an understanding was created and is found behaving in friendly and good terms. Thereby a good relationship in created.

Language classes English.

This language training brought close contact of these two communities and relationships improved between them. The English language classes were conducted as a means of bringing them together. The target was 50 students but 55 students were benefited.

The class was conducted in Navatkudah with the inclusion of Tamil and Muslim Children. The classes were planned for one year and were and held 04 days a week.

The test results of the class is as follows: Those who can write English – 20 These who can read English - 25

In view of this a good relationship among the communities is being maintained.

6. Youths club activities:

The activities under this were, organisation of youth clubs, expand them in numbers, and promote them to be strong youth and direct them to be self - dependant groups. Once organised into groups, the ODW activities were implemented with the participation of these youth clubs. Their participation was also obtained in preparing the project proposal and implementing same.

A sum of RS.10000.00 has been granted individually to a total of 07 Youth clubs in order to strengthen their activities. The particulars are as follows.
